**200 YEARS OF THE EUCHARIST IN AUSTRALIA**

This weekend at St. Patrick's Church, The Rocks, Sydney, marks the anniversary of 200 years of the Eucharist being preserved in Australia. It also celebrates the faith of those lay Catholics in the early colony who kept vigil with the Eucharist until an official chaplain arrived. Fr Jeremiah O'Flynn arrived in Sydney as unofficial chaplain to the Catholic community at the end of 1817. He told Governor Lachlan Macquarie his credentials would soon follow but, when after six months no official papers for Fr O'Flynn had arrived, he was arrested and shipped back home. Whether by accident or design, Fr O'Flynn left a consecrated host behind in a pyx in either the home of William Davis or James Dempsey (or possibly both).

In a colonial Church with no priest or Mass, and where Catholics – including Mr Davis – were punished for refusing to participate in Protestant services, the reserved Sacrament became the focus of Catholic life. The laity kept daily vigil before the Blessed Sacrament during the many months until the first official Catholic chaplains arrived.

The site of both Mr Davis and Mr Dempsey's historical residences is in the parish of St Patrick's, and the Church was built to commemorate the preservation of the Eucharist within the parish. Current parish priest of St Patrick's, Fr Michael Whelan SM, said this sense of history deepens our sense of ourselves and provides a rich contribution to the growth of community. "In particular, knowing what those early Catholics suffered because of their faith, is inspiring," he said. Commenting on the notion that both the Davis and Dempsey homes were situated within the parish of St Patrick's, Fr Whelan said: "In a very real sense, the cradle of the Catholic Church in Australia is right here!"

Following is a brief report on what you as a Parish do for people in need in our area through the Subiaco Conference of the St Vincent de Paul Society.

Vinnies is a lay catholic organisation which provides emergency relief to those in need. In addition to Subiaco, our territory extends to Shenton Park, Daglish, East and West Perth as well as the city. We have sensational support from you and the Parish Council by way of food and financial donations to complement our fundraising through our sausage sizzles and September Street Appeal.

**What do we do:** We are 1 of 75 active conferences throughout the state. The Call Centre at our head office refers up to four clients each day, most requesting a visit. In the last financial year Vinnies assisted some 38,000 West Australians and all are treated in the strictest of confidence.

**We provide:**

- food and supermarket vouchers - Woolworths, Coles, IGA and Farmer Jacks.
- clothing vouchers to be used at any one of our 48 retail stores.
- furniture, bed and kitchen packs. It's not unusual to visit someone in new accommodation whose only possession is a sleeping bag.
- assistance with bills and rent. Synergy and Alinta help us in this regard.
- financial counselling. Suzanne Long is our go to guru and does amazing work. When you're on a disability pension of \$570 per fortnight you really need to know how to budget.

In addition to the above, Vinnies assists in other ways. Sometimes a friendly face and a chat is very welcome.

Finally, our Winter Appeal is about to commence. We will have baskets in the foyer and side exit and welcome your food donations (no nuts please). Some people may prefer to make a monetary donation and we also have envelopes in the foyer for that purpose.
